
Furthermore, our aim is to provide the children with an exciting and broad curriculum that meets the needs of the students within a friendly environment in which each child feels happy and safe.

HOW THE GREEK SCHOOL OF COVENTRY OPERATES

The Greek School of Coventry operates every Saturday from 10:30 a.m. to 15:00 p.m. During the week we offer Greek Language and Culture courses to Adults who are interested in learning Greek as a foreign language.

The school year begins in early September and ends in early July. It is divided into three terms, three months each. Shortly before the end of each term, all students are examined on what they have learned during the term. Undoubtedly, a revision takes place a week before the exam at school for better results in the test. A Parents' Evening takes place at the end of each term. Invitations and letters are sent close to each event. Parents and teachers discuss children's progress and find solutions to academic or behavioral problems. Our school has a new parents' evening at the start of the year discussing how to improve the quality of education for our students, the school policies, the classroom teaching methods and strategies, work which the children will be covering and the expectations which the school has of their students during that year. It's also an opportunity for parents to ask questions and to see their child's work area.

Throughout the year the major Religious and National Holidays, are celebrated with honor at the Greek School, involving all our students. These are: "The National commemoration of the 28th of October 1940, "Christmas Day", "The Three Hierarchs, Greek Letters Day", "25 March 1821, The Feast of the Annunciation & EOKA 1955-59", " End of School Year ". In May we organize our educational school trip, combining fun and education.

OUR SCHOOL POLICIES & PROCEDURES

We would like to inform you that the Greek School of Coventry has approved **Child Protection Policies** and **Health and Safety Policies**, as part of our Gold Award, which you can access on our school website. We would like to take this opportunity to remind you that we take the responsibility of child care and protection very seriously. We believe that all of us, parents and teachers, have a joint responsibility for the care of our children.

We need to have a clear understanding of the expectations of our role and what we should do in different situations. This is the only way to maintain a safe environment and ensure that risks and hazards are dealt with appropriately. In brief, teachers supervise pupils whilst on school premises. They fully understand the basic safety and supervision requirements and they are aware of their supervisory responsibilities, both in lessons and when the pupils are out of class.

THE IMPORTANCE OF SUPERVISION

SUPERVISION BEFORE SCHOOL

Parents/guardians must assume the responsibility for bringing their children to school **10-15 minutes before the start of the lesson**. Teachers are directly responsible for the safety of children once they line up for assembly/prayers. It is very important to deliver your child to the teacher, when you arrive at school.

Once parents leave the premises, the front gates are closed and the xfront door is locked.

SUPERVISION DURING BREAK TIME

There is a supervision rota for breaks. Two teachers are responsible for supervision when children are allowed outside, weather permitting. The remaining teachers are responsible for the supervision of children inside the school premises. When the pupils from inside the school go outside, the indoor supervisor go with them. Pupils are not allowed to remain by themselves in a classroom during the break. The purpose of appropriate supervision is to deter children taking part in dangerous activities as well as to stop dangerous activities.

SUPERVISION AFTER SCHOOL

Parents/guardians must assume the responsibility for picking their children up promptly after the school day ends. Whenever parents cannot pick up their children within the specified time frame, they must contact the school to inform the child's teacher, so that arrangements can be made to safeguard the child until the parent/carer arrives. We assure you that your children are kept safely on the school premises and a responsible person wait with them until a parent/carer comes.

It is very important to keep us updated in case you change your mobile number/landline/email address.

Also, you must notify us in advance if someone else needs to pick your children up.

Our school needs your co-operation in these circumstances. We appreciate your ongoing support as we continue to ensure your child's safety and well-being. If you have any concerns regarding any issues of child care please raise it with the head teacher first or the school committee.

Parent-Teacher Communication



Communication is fundamental in developing positive home and school links. We endeavour to keep our community as up to date and informed about what is happening in the wider school community and at grade level as best we can. Whilst we have many forms of electronic communication through our school website, email, class blogs etc. we also encourage you to meet face to face with your child's teachers if you have any concerns or information you would like to share. Our teachers make themselves available to meet in person. It is advisable to set up a time to meet with your child's teacher/s to ensure you have adequate time to discuss concerns.

School Times

We would like to remind you that school commences at 10:30. There is supervision on the playground from 10:15-10:30. We kindly ask you to arrive at school before the bell rings, so your child does not feel rushed. School finishes at 15:00. Please note that there is no supervision on the playground after school. Please collect RECEPTION-YEAR 1-2-3-4 students from their classrooms doors promptly at 15:00p.m..

Students can only play on the playground after-school if they have their parent present for supervision.

Please note that if for some unavoidable reason you want to take your child on holiday in term time, you must send a letter informing the Head Teacher and the teacher. Greek School of Coventry will not agree to a child missing more than a total of ten Saturdays for family holidays in any school year unless there's a very good reason.

If your child is ill please phone school by 10.00 a.m. on the day of absence.

Library Books

Each Saturday children select a library book from the school library to take home to read. It should be returned to school within two weeks. If the book is lost or damaged we request £3 towards the cost of a replacement.

Portfolios

Students who attended last school year teachers created a portfolio. This collection of work is designed to give insight into the learning that had taken place at school in the classroom and in single subject areas.

The significance of Greek Lessons

Beyond learning the Greek language, students have the opportunity to become familiar with Greek music, dancing, customs and traditions, as well as national and religious holidays, in exactly the same way as they are celebrated and honored in Greece. Following that, our priority is the teaching of the History of Greece because through the study of our Greek civilization they will be able to build their national and cultural identity. Besides, our goal is to make them aware of the contribution of the Greek nation to the global civilization and establish the relevant awareness.

The Significance of Religious Education

Is there any benefit of religious education in Greek school? And how does it affect the child? Are the implications positive or negative? To be more precise, what are the learning effects in Christian religious education of these students at the various levels of the primary school regarding their understanding of religion? All these interesting questions have a good answer. To begin with, religious education is considered to be a humanity subject. In the national curriculum of Greece-Cyprus is stated that the aim of humanities subjects (religious education, history, geography, citizenship and environmental studies) is to explore and study the religious, historical, cultural, political, economical, environmental and social life of Greece/Cyprus and other countries. Religious education is significant because children need to experience the Christian way of love towards all people, regardless color, religion and race. Furthermore, via religious education they learn and understand better the major celebrations and events of Christianity (Christmas, Easter, the Feast of the Annunciation, name-days).

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

We need to register all candidates and make a full payment, by **Saturday, 13 December 2014**

Students who are interested in taking the exams, must fill out a registration form (in English and in capitals) and return it to the head teacher along with the payment. The Greek School will provide you with a registration form.

IMPORTANT: If you have previously taken exams and you already have a UCI number (candidate number) you need to provide us with that in full (if you are not sure what your UCI number is you need to contact your school's Examination Officer). By providing us with the UCI number EDEXCEL will be able to forward your results to your English school (this is important for candidates taking GCE AS and GCE Unit 2 to use it for a University Entry). If you also have a previous candidate number from Greek examinations please provide us with that too.





Mobile phones & Electronic devices (video games, iPods, photography) Policy

Students are not allowed to bring Video games, iPods on school premises. Any child carrying such devices in school shall be asked to hand it to teachers or parents before the start of the lesson. Parents are advised to discourage their children from carrying them in school. Mobile phones are permitted but only to be used in accordance with the rules explained by teachers: their teachers ask them to hand it to them on the start of the lesson. Cameras are allowed but unauthorized recording or taking pictures of students or of teachers is prohibited.

THE VALUE OF HOMEWORK

Homework is important because it is at the intersection between home and school. It serves as a window through which you can observe your children's education and express positive attitudes towards your children and their education. Furthermore, it offers schools an opportunity to let parents know what their children are learning. Thus, homework can play a public relations role by keeping parents informed about class activities and policies. It also fulfills an administrative role in helping schools achieve their overall mission of improving students' achievement.

Each week, the teacher will prepare worksheets and activities based on different themes and projects will be taking place, so the students will be able to retain and expand their knowledge in each subject. We offer students diaries so you can see every week what homework is being given. If problems occur such as your child is taking far too long to complete assignments you should contact your child's teacher. In case of absence, teachers will send you the homework via email.





ADULT GREEK LANGUAGE & CULTURE COURSES @ THE GREEK SCHOOL OF COVENTRY

Dear all,

As you all may know, the Greek language is a beautiful language with melodious words and poetic meanings. It holds an important place in the histories of Europe. It has the longest documented history of any other language of the Indo-European family of languages and 34 centuries of written records, so surely, this is a huge legacy for all of modern civilization to keep and to enrich. Many Greek words have been widely borrowed into other languages, in fields like mathematics, astronomy, philosophy etc. Greek word elements in common with Latin words are the foundation of the scientific and technical modern vocabulary.

We would like to inform you that the Greek School of Coventry offers Greek Language Courses for adults who are absolute **Beginners**, **Post Beginners** students and those who have reached an **Intermediate**, **Post Intermediate** & **Advanced Level** in 74 hours and includes grammar, reading, speaking and writing. Our courses also provide an insight into Greek/Cypriot culture and civilization.

**Special courses of Modern Greek Literature and Culture and of Ancient Greek/Latin are offered upon request.*

Our Greek teachers are qualified, specialized and experienced in teaching Greek as a foreign language.

Teaching : 1 x 2 hour class per week plus some independent learning.

The course costs £12 per lesson. Students give the money to the teacher at the beginning of the term.

Beginners/Post Beginners/Intermediate Level: Every Wednesday from 17:30 to 19:30.

Post Intermediate Level: Every Thursday from 17:30 to 19:30.

Advanced Level: Every Friday from 17:30 to 19:30.

(*We can reschedule the timetable according to your schedule.)

Beginners Level

You will become familiar with the Greek alphabet and learn to read and write. Your competence in a range of simple, everyday language tasks will be encouraged and enhanced. The course will provide a basic knowledge of the structure and vocabulary of the language, developing listening, speaking, reading and writing skills. Topics areas will be covered are: Greetings & Introductions; Ordering food & drinks; Meeting people; Shopping; Directions, travel & transport; Booking rooms & reserving tickets; Time & calendar; Holidays./ Grammar: Nouns-gender, number & case; Verbs- present tense; Question forms; Numbers; Prepositions; Personal pronouns; Agreement of adjectives; Some idiomatic usage.

Post Beginners Level

You will further improve your basic language and listening skills and introduce more complex grammar. You will also develop your skills to communicate at a post-beginners level in a target language context. You will be taught vocabulary in the topic areas (Numbers (up to 100) Phonetics/letter patterns; Describing the home/accommodation; Booking a hotel; Directions - prepositions etc; Describing family members; Shopping - (currency, change, preference); Transport; Weather) enabling you to hold a simple conversation in the language. You will understand frequently used words and phrases and you will be able to formulate sentences.

Intermediate Level

You will begin to expand your knowledge by carrying on dialogues, following more complicated conversations, and learning more complex Greek vocabulary and grammar. Intermediate courses focus on describing time, ask questions, people descriptions, give and ask directions, travel vocabulary, verbs and many more topics.

Students who already have a basic knowledge in Greek, often feel insecure in using the language. This course expands the students' ability by reviewing grammar, extra grammar on future and past tenses, more vocabulary and strategies needed to describe and narrate in future and past tenses. More advanced grammar topics are introduced and/or reviewed, such as the passive voice, past tenses (simple past and past continuous) future tenses (simple future and future continuous), personal pronouns.

Post Intermediate Level

The aim of the course is mainly the further development and use of the Greek Language –practicing vocabulary or syntactical and grammatical linguistic rules- to enable you to communicate more fluently in the Greek language in realistic everyday situations. The emphasis will be on oral communication. You will also develop Vocabulary and Grammar in a post-beginners' level – going up to intermediate level.
